VILLAGE HALL WINTER TALKS

<u>'Ello, 'Ello – what's going on 'ere then?</u> – a title for the January talk which takes place on Thursday 4th January at 7.30 pm. **Dr Richard Newman**, an historian who hails from Cumbria, is in overall charge of the archaeological digs being carried out over the 37 kilometre power-cabling tract of land between Butley and Brantham, via Waldringfield, Hemley and Newbourne. This project, purportedly the biggest 'dig' going on in Europe at the present time, involves nearly 150 archaeologists and, as some of you will know from recent exhibitions, they are finding 'things'.

Don't miss this <u>unique opportunity</u> to find out more about the discoveries and their implications.

Richard and his education officer, Dr Claire Halley, addressed the History Group in November; they have very kindly agreed to speak to a wider audience in this forthcoming Winter Talk.

On Thursday 1st February at 7.30 Anthony and Celia Mason will present 18,000 miles and still the lentils are fresh – an illustrated account of an epic sea-trip by two local personalities who need no introduction.
